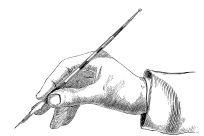

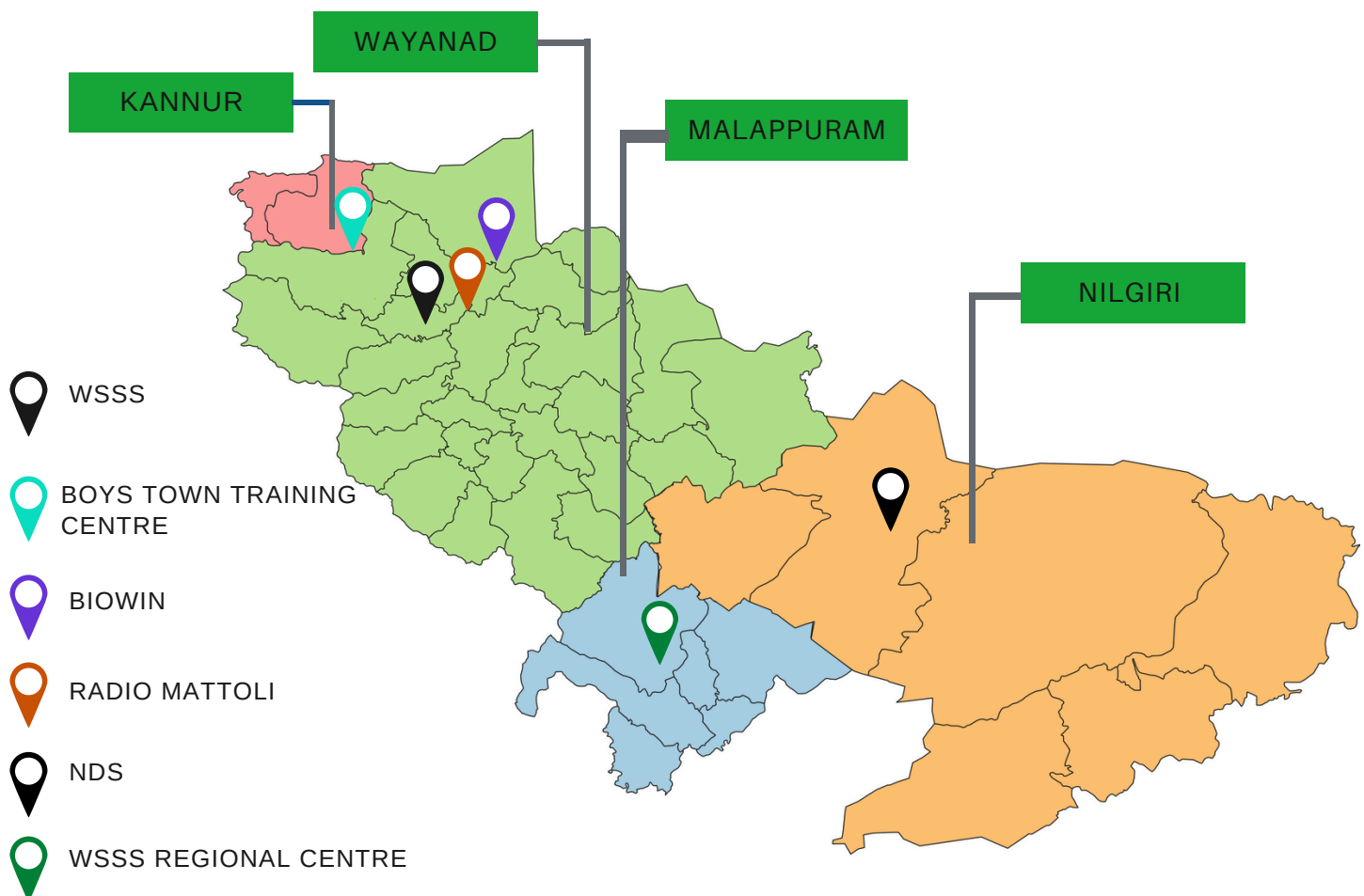

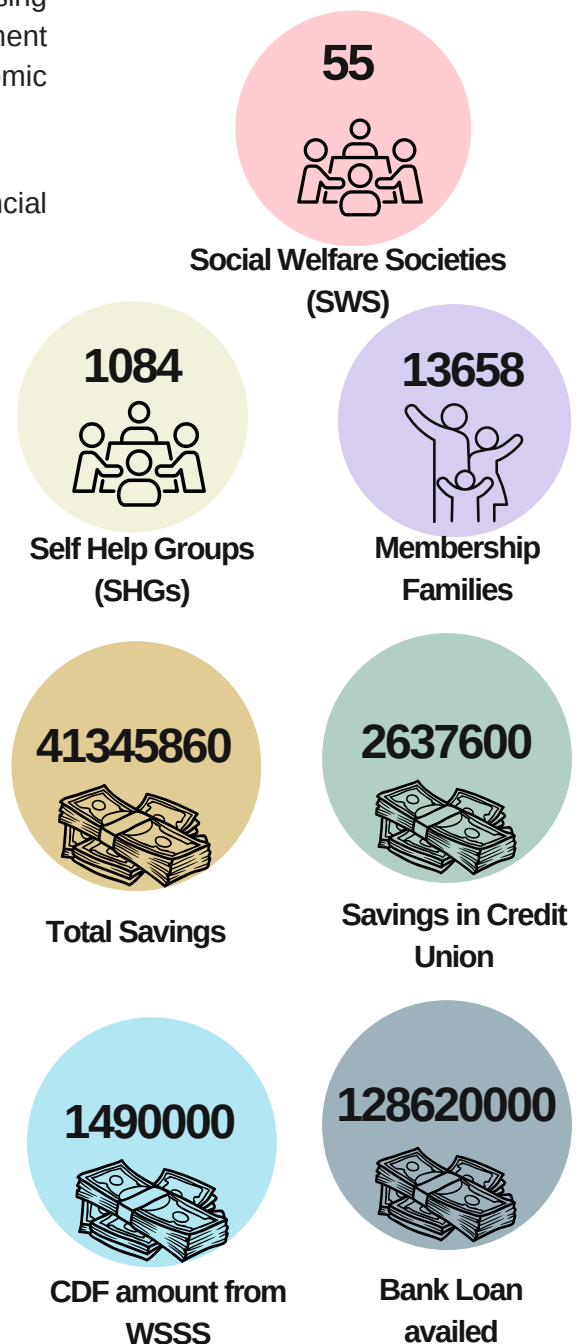
Social Welfare Societies (SWS)

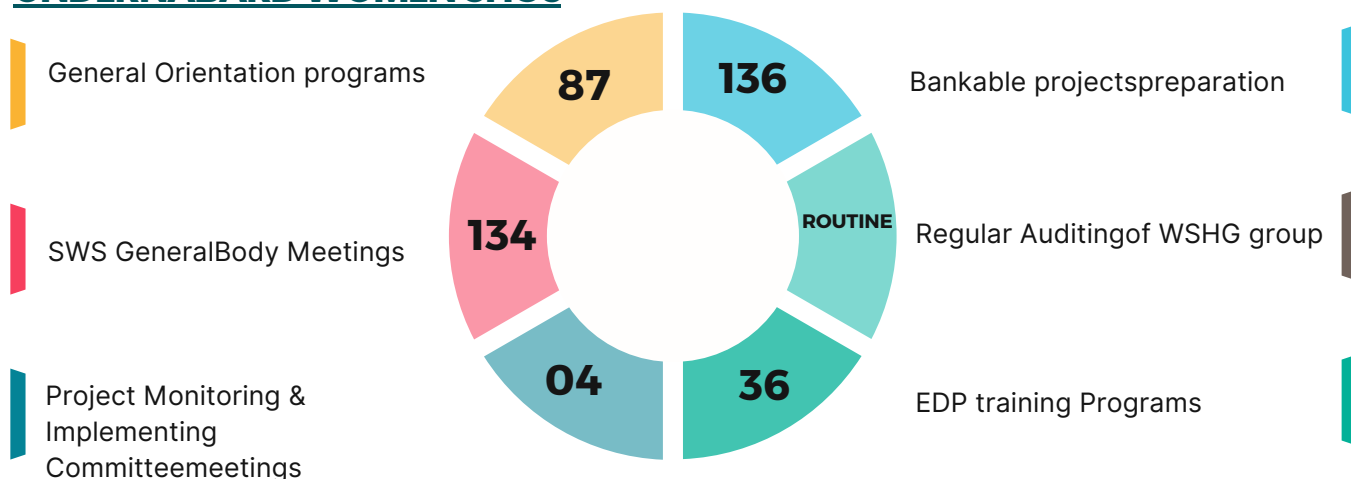

DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA



Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) is a skilling and placement initiative launched by the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India. With 55 million potential rural workers aged 15 to 35 (according to the 2011 Census), India has the opportunity to transform its demographic surplus into a global workforce, addressing a projected shortage of 57 million workers by 2030. DDU-GKY aims to promote inclusive growth by enhancing the skills of rural youth from poor families. The programme is implemented in partnership with state governments, technical support agencies such as the National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (NIRD & PR), and Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs).

ACHIEVEMENTS

WSSS officially launched the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) on 12th August 2016. We have completed 36 batches in various courses, training a total of 1,296 students across 44 batches, and have successfully carried out assessments and placements. Approximately 1,005 candidates have been placed in different companies and restaurants, with 15 foreign placements achieved. Considering our performance over the past years, WSSS has received new targets for 315 candidates. Most of our students are now working outside the state with competitive salaries.

STUDENTS MOBILISATION, COUNSELLING AND SELECTION

The selection of students for this project is conducted through a mobilisation camp, where counselling plays a crucial role in the candidate selection process. Kudumbashree has facilitated the arrangements for mobilisation at the initial stage.

REGULAR MORD, KUDUMBASHREE INSPECTION

To ensure the high quality of training, both the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) and the Kudumbashree team conduct regular inspections.

NCVT CERTIFICATION

We provide NCVT and SSC certification for each course, and we conduct external examinations for every batch, after which we distribute their certificates.

MAJOR JOB PLACEMENT EMPLOYERS

This project is job-oriented, and we strive to ensure that all students secure positions that align with their aspirations and attitudes. To date, we have successfully placed nearly 165 students in various companies. Some of the main placement institutions include Biowin Agro Research, Walnut, KITEX Garments Pvt Ltd, Chikins, Jayalakshmi, KFC, McDonald's, Hyson Restaurant Pvt Ltd, Chinoose Food Products Pvt Ltd, ID Fresh Pvt Ltd Bangalore, Santhome Creations, Hi Tex Wedding Castles, Patturumal Wedding Centre, Joy Ice-creams, Cafe Coffee Day, Woodland Hotels, Oxi Farm Resort, Shobha Developers, Burmman Hospitality, Aloe Vera, and other small industries in Kerala.











ALTERNATIVE ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM



Over the past four decades, WSSS has actively promoted cost-effective renewable energy technologies to meet the energy needs of rural communities. By integrating alternative energy sources such as biogas, solar lights, rainwater tanks, and smokeless chulhas into sustainable agriculture and livelihood projects, WSSS has made a significant impact on rural development. Awareness programmes and waste management systems have also been key components of its work. As a pioneer in ferro-cement technology, WSSS has applied this innovative and cost-effective method to construct biogas plants, vermicompost tanks, and rainwater harvesting systems, achieving a 30% reduction in construction costs. Last year, WSSS constructed 14 biogas plants with subsidies from the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC).

ASHAKIRANAM CANCER CARE CAMPAIGN

Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS), through the Ashakiranam project, promotes cancer prevention and other health initiatives across India. In association with Caritas India, WSSS has successfully contributed to these efforts by implementing various cancer and killer disease prevention programmes. One notable initiative is WSSS's organic farming programme, which involves 15,000 farmers and fosters a healthier ecosystem for both humans and living organisms. This aligns with Ashakiranam's objectives of promoting health through sustainable practices. Additionally, WSSS has identified and trained 200 volunteers through a General Awareness Programme, empowering them to support the community with knowledge about cancer prevention. These efforts reflect WSSS's commitment to building a healthier and more informed society.

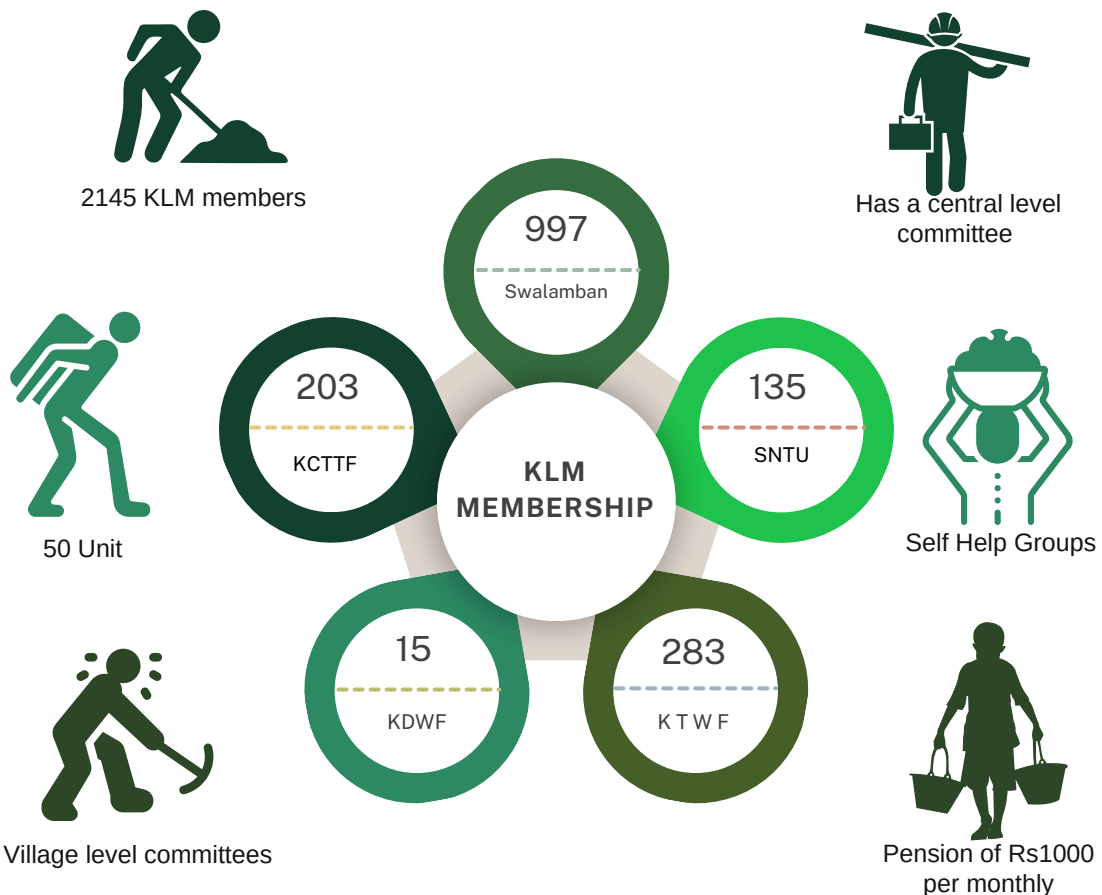

KERALA LABOUR MOVEMENT



The Kerala Labour Movement (KLM), registered under the Kerala Charitable Societies Registration Act of 1955, was established in 2004 (Reg. No. ER 620/04) to organise informal workers in Kerala. Operating under the Labour Commission of the Catholic Bishops Council of Kerala, KLM addresses the developmental needs of unorganised labourers. It has a central committee with diocesan representation and functions through parish or village-level committees. The KLM's unit in the Mananthavady Diocese supports job security and comprehensive development for unorganised labourers in Wayanad and parts of Kannur and Malappuram. With 1,572 members across 50 units, most members participate in the Swalamban Scheme, which ensures a minimum monthly pension of ₹1,000. KLM also manages welfare schemes such as the KCTTF, SNTU, KDWF, and KTTF for various labour sectors.





COMMUNITY RADIO MATTOLI



Community Radio Mattoli (90.4 FM) serves as the Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) wing of the Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS). Licensed by the Union Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, it operates from Dwaraka in Mananthavady, located in Kerala's Wayanad district. As a Community Radio Service (CRS), Mattoli caters to diverse communities within its transmission zone, with a particular focus on marginalised groups. The station provides a platform for farmers, tribal communities, dalits, women, and children to express their views and have their voices heard. By promoting inclusive communication, Radio Mattoli ensures that even underrepresented voices are given a space to speak out. In addition to entertainment, it broadcasts educational and informative content, significantly contributing to the overall socio-economic and cultural development of its listeners.





SAVE A FAMILY PLAN

The Save A Family Plan (SAFP) began its journey in 1977 under the Mananthavady Diocese. Over the past 40 years, more than 6,300 families within the diocese have received support from the organisation. By the end of the previous financial year, around 330 families were receiving assistance under this initiative. According to the eligibility criteria, many families involved in the project are affected by cancer, HIV, have disabled members, or are headed by widows.

REGIONAL MEETING

During this financial year, Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) conducted regional meetings in the Mananthavady, Kalpetta, and Pulpally regions. Rev. Fr. Jinoj Palathadathil, the Director of WSSS, led a session on social security schemes.



EDP TRAINING

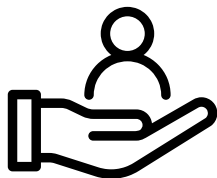
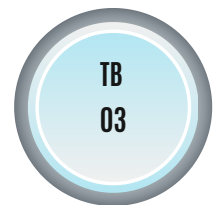
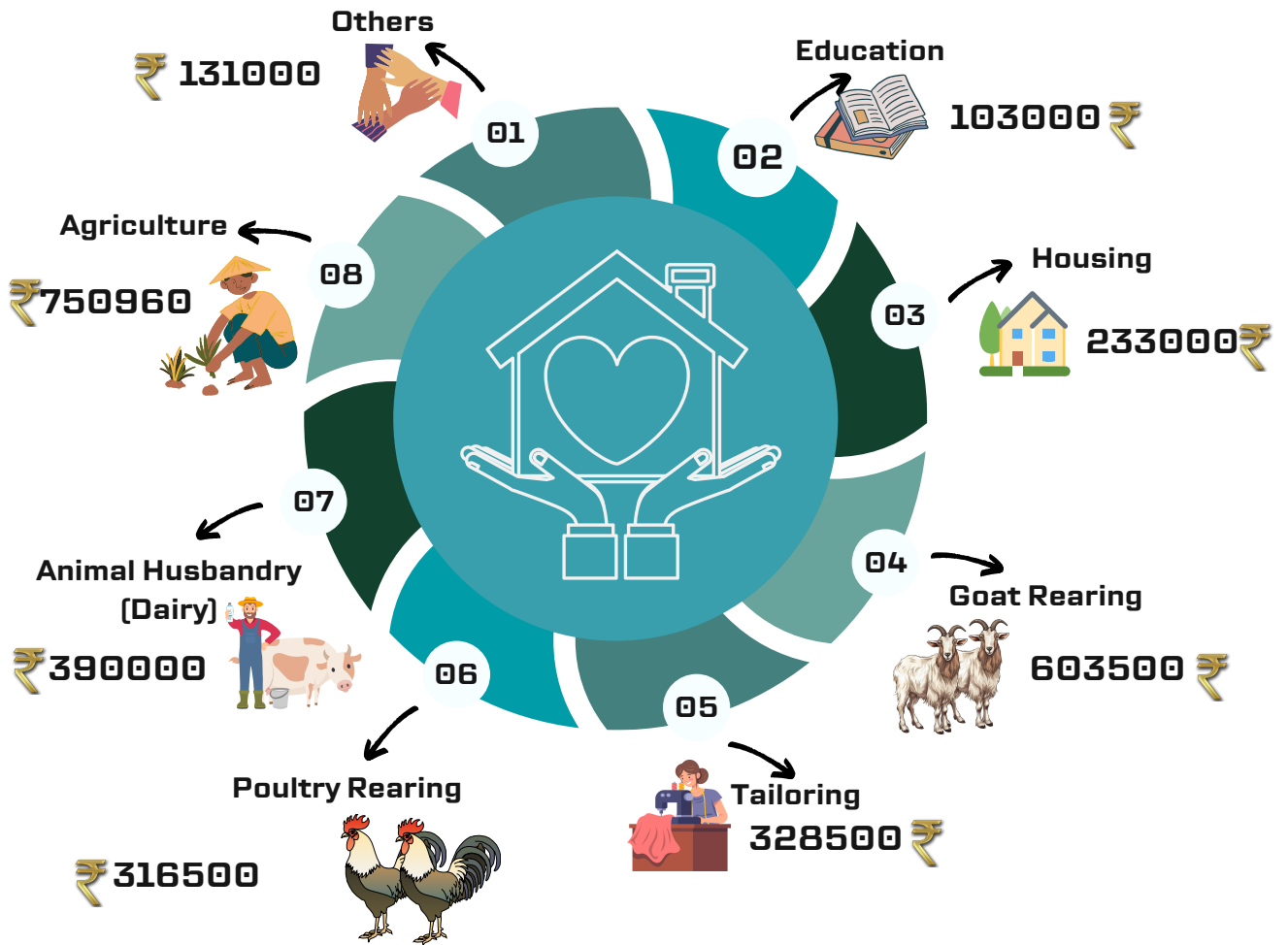
This year, 30 new family beneficiaries received one-day Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP) training, which included a general orientation and a session on soap and detergent making. The training inspired many participants to start small-scale soap production, prompting them to purchase materials to begin their own ventures.

FAMILY ASSISTING TEAM MEETINGS

The family assistance team, including the parish priest, local sponsor sisters, SHG group leaders, and PRI members, gathered at the parish level to discuss the families, aiming for better monitoring and guidance. Additionally, a special group meeting is conducted twice a year at the parish level under each parish group to further support these efforts.

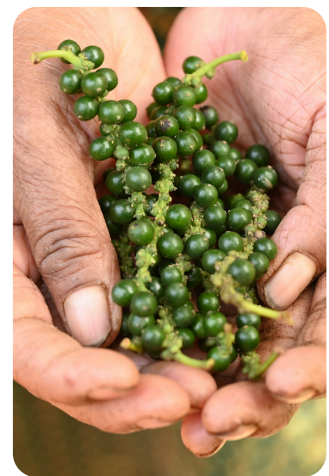

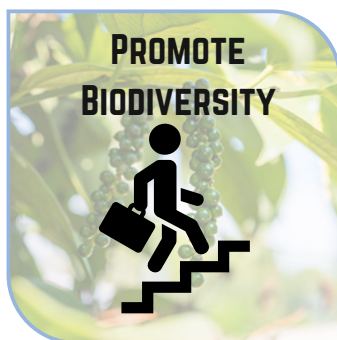
Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) is implementing a project at Boys Town in Wayanad District that has significantly influenced the organisation's activities in biodiversity conservation and organic farming. This initiative focuses on conserving and promoting traditional pepper varieties identified in the Malabar belt. Given that Wayanad is part of the Nilgiri Biosphere, the diversity of traditional pepper is exceptionally high. The current project aims to conserve traditional pepper and promote the cultivation practices of notable varieties, alongside broader efforts in biodiversity conservation and traditional farming practices.

To address unemployment among girls who have completed school, the Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) initiated a tailoring vocational course 18 years ago. Following government syllabi and norms, successful trainees received certificates qualifying them to become tailoring teachers. Recently, the course was upgraded by the Kerala State Technical Education Department to "Fashion Designing & Garment Technology," incorporating new subjects such as embroidery, painting, basic computer education, and spoken English to meet evolving industry demands. The two-year course aims to equip young women in Wayanad with skills that enhance their employment potential in the garment sector. Candidates must have completed the 10th standard, with a maximum age limit of 35 years.





MEDICINAL PLANTS CONSERVATION PARK & BOTANICAL MUSEUM

(REVITALIZATION OF LOCAL HEALTH TRADITIONS AND MEDICINAL PLANTS CONSERVATION)



Since its inception, the Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) has maintained a special interest in both indigenous people and their traditional practices. A planned healthcare approach, aligned with indigenous practices and herbal medicines, was introduced into the WSSS programme in 1989. Village health clubs were established, followed by a series of training sessions. Despite these efforts, tribal communities continue to face marginalisation and are often victims of genetic disorders and diseases such as sickle-cell anaemia. WSSS combines its knowledge, skills, and networks related to herbal and traditional medicines to treat these conditions effectively.

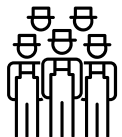

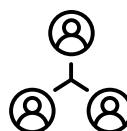

Springshed Gramasabha



The Wayanad Social Service Society conducted a special Gramasabha on 27th July 2024 to plan a three-year spring conservation project in the Pulikkad watershed, Edavaka Gram Panchayat, with support from NABARD.

Baseline Survey



A baseline survey is currently underway in the Pulikkad Springshed area, with 208 families surveyed so far by MSW/BSW students, WSSS, and Village Water Committee (VWC) members using a specially designed survey form.

Exposure Visit



On 17th August 2024, we organised an exposure visit for Village Water Committee (VWC) members to the Kundaram watershed in Kasaragod, as part of the upcoming Springshed project for the Pulikkad watershed.

As part of the Pulikkad Springshed development programme, a key initiative involved extending the Kandakaranamkolli-Pulikkad irrigation canal by an additional 150 metres.





NABARD- MULLANKOLLY SPRINGSHED BASED WATERSHED PROJECT

The Wayanad Social Service Society commenced this new project in 2022, implemented in the Mullankolli watershed area of Thirunnelli Gram Panchayat for a duration of three years, with financial assistance from NABARD. The primary objective of the project is to protect the area's springs through soil and water conservation activities.

The project is executed in two phases: the Pre-Project Implementation Phase (PIIP) and the Project Implementation Phase (PIP). The first phase, PIIP, was successfully completed last year, with the Detailed Project Report (DPR) sanctioned by NABARD. This year, the second phase, PIP, has also been completed.

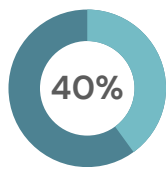

NABARD JLG PROJECT

JOINT LIABILITY GROUPS.

Another project initiated this year is the formation of Joint Liability Groups (JLGs). The Wayanad Social Service Society implemented this project in collaboration with NABARD. A Joint Liability Group is an informal group comprising preferably 4 to 10 individuals for the purpose of availing bank loans, either individually or through the group mechanism, against mutual guarantee.



SALIENT FEATURES OF JOINT LIABILITY GROUPS:-

The Wayanad Social Service Society formed 200 groups in the first year itself and secured a loan of 4.20 crores for various income generation programmes.

1. MEMBERS SHOULD HAVE A COMMON ACTIVITY.
2. MEMBERS NEED NOT TO HAVE A LAND TITLE.
3. MEMBERS SHOULD BE OF THE SAME VILLAGE.
4. ONLY ONE MEMBER OF A FAMILY CAN BECOME A MEMBER OF JLGs.
5. MEMBERS SHOULD NOT BE A DEFAULTER OF BANK LOAN.
6. MEMBER SHOULD HOLD REGULAR MEETINGS.



JEEVAN MADHUR-MICRO INSURANCE POLICY(LIC)

The Jeevan Madhur policy, a micro-insurance product by the Life Insurance Corporation (LIC), is designed to serve economically disadvantaged individuals aged between 18 and 60. The policy provides a sum assured ranging from ₹5,000 to ₹30,000, with a flexible term of 5 to 15 years. This affordable and accessible policy gained widespread popularity after being endorsed by Dr A.P.J. Abdul Kalam during LIC's Golden Jubilee celebration, further enhancing its appeal to low-income individuals seeking financial security.



SNEHANIDHI

Snehanidhi is a benevolent fund created in 1980 under the Bishop's direction to support families in distress during Lent. Since its inception, Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) has successfully managed the programme through the Foranes, providing essential assistance to those in need.



JANASREE BHIMA YOJANA

In the 2008-09 budget, the Union Finance Minister introduced "Janashree Bima Yojana" (JBY), a life and disability insurance scheme for women self-help groups (SHGs) linked to bank credit. The scheme provides insurance coverage to rural and urban poor individuals living below or just above the poverty line.



LEGAL AID CENTRE

The Legal Aid Centre, located at the WSSS campus and sponsored by the Diocese of Mananthavady, is a voluntary, non-sectarian, non-political, educational, and charitable organisation. It focuses on providing free professional legal services to the poor, unorganised, and exploited sections of society, particularly women, children, Dalits, and tribal communities.



JEEVAS

The Jeevas Philanthropic Medical Project is a humanitarian initiative of the Mananthavady Diocese, undertaken by WSSS and Kerala Labour Movement (KLM) in collaboration with Star Health Insurance Company. This policy is designed to provide health insurance coverage to families from low-income backgrounds, offering comprehensive family protection at an affordable premium of ₹3,000. It aims to extend support to those without existing health insurance, ensuring accessible healthcare for the general populace.

SAMRUDHAKUDUMBAM PROJECT

The Family Development Programme is the core initiative of the Wayanad Social Service Society. For over 50 years, through the Save A Family Plan, WSSS has assisted thousands of impoverished families within the boundaries of the Mananthavady Diocese in becoming self-reliant. By partnering with these families, the Family Development Programme supports them in reaching their full potential and achieving success through key elements such as income-generating initiatives, ongoing local support, and individual family interactions, needs assessments, and facilitation, resulting in positive outcomes.

The Samrudhakudumbam Family Development Programme was implemented in October 2020 with the support of Biwin Agro Research. The areas of programme implementation include six regions, namely Sulthan Bathery, Kalpetta, and Thariode forane in Wayanad District.

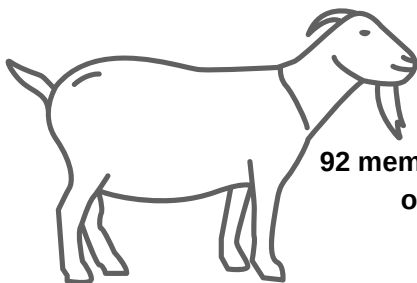


LIVELIHOOD AND ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The programme aims to enhance their exceptional aptitude, enabling them to emerge as successful entrepreneurs and catalysts for generating more employment opportunities.



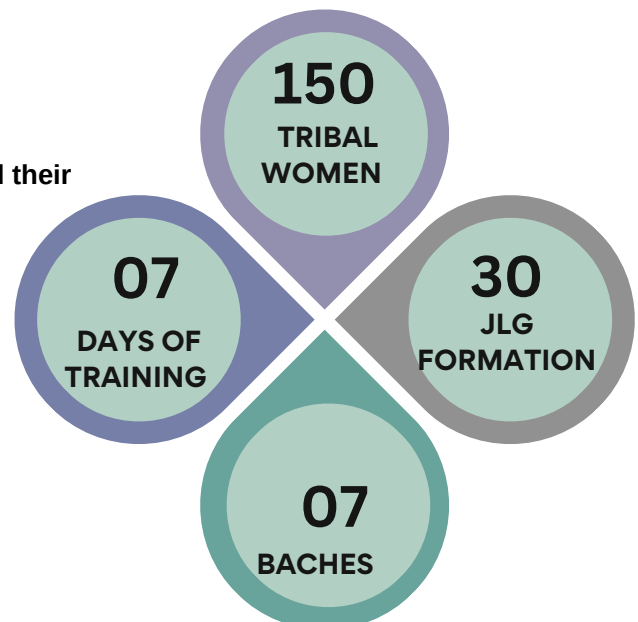
The credit linkage process in the Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programme (LEDP) is progressing smoothly. Loan applications for all 30 Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) have been submitted to Canara Bank, Korom, and Canara Bank, Thalapuzha. Each member of the JLGs is availing a loan of Rs. 50,000 for purchasing goats. So far, 82 members from 17 JLGs have already received their loans. The banks have assured that the remaining loans will be disbursed before 25th August 2023. This timely disbursement will enable the beneficiaries to effectively utilise the funds for their goat-rearing initiatives under the project.

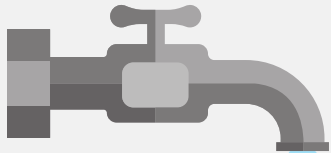

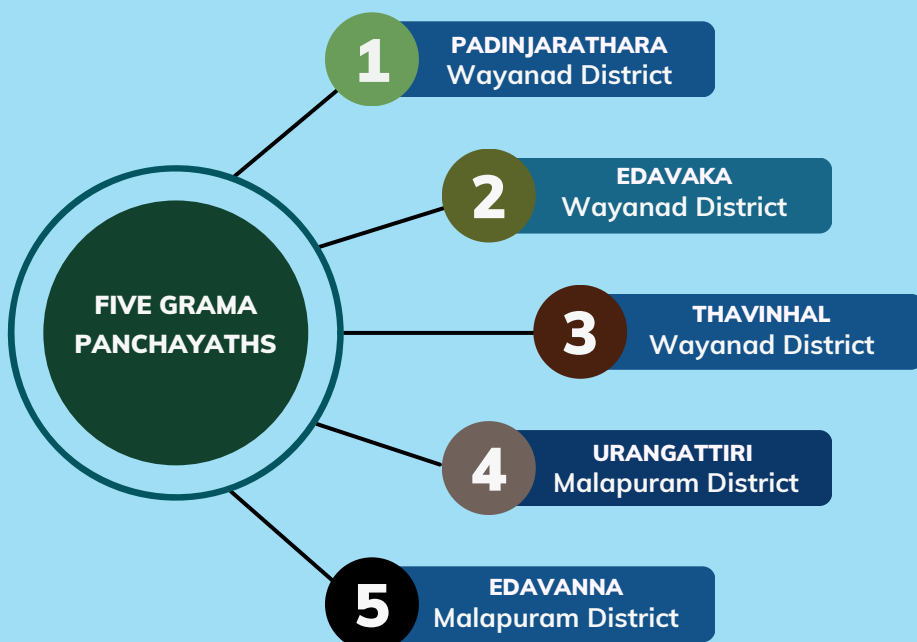

PROMOTION OF DAIRY FARMING AS SECOND LINE OF STABLE LIVELIHOOD IN DISASTER SHATTERED AND CROP PERISHED WAYANAD, PREDOMINANTLY SETTLED BY MARGINAL AND MIGRANT FARMING COMMUNITIES.



The Promotion of Dairy Farming project stands as a beacon of hope amid the challenges faced by the people of Wayanad, a region nestled in the hilly terrain of north-eastern Kerala, along the Western Ghats in the Nilgiri Biosphere. Predominantly home to marginal and migrant farming communities, Wayanad has struggled with the aftermath of disasters and crop failures, leaving its inhabitants vulnerable and in urgent need of sustainable livelihood options.



The Promotion of Dairy Farming project, supported by CONFERENZA EPISCOPALE ITALIANA (CEI) and Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS), aimed to alleviate economic hardship while fostering long-term sustainability and socio-economic development in Wayanad. Focused on holistic growth and community empowerment, the project exemplified the power of collaboration in transforming the lives of the region's marginalised communities. As it concludes, it leaves a legacy of resilience, hope, and brighter prospects for the future.

The project aims to uplift the distressed rural farming community, who have been thrown off balance by a prolonged agricultural crisis, by restoring their shattered economy and livelihoods through viable alternatives. It seeks to implement sustainable secondary occupations, providing much-needed relief and stability to the affected farmers.

SAVE A FAMILY PLAN, HOUSING PROJECTS



Introduction The Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS), with support from Save a Family Plan (SAFP), has undertaken an impactful housing initiative aimed at providing safe and dignified shelter to those in need. The project involves the construction of 39 houses for economically disadvantaged families in Wayanad District, fulfilling a crucial need for stable housing among vulnerable communities.

Under the guidelines and support of Save a Family Plan, WSSS selected beneficiaries based on specific criteria designed to target those most in need. Priority was given to families living below the poverty line (BPL) and with limited landholdings. Beneficiaries were selected based on SAFPs stringent criteria, ensuring that only those genuinely in need benefit from the programme.

The primary goal of the housing project is to empower low-income families by providing them with a safe and permanent place to live. By ensuring these families have access to stable housing, WSSS and SAFPs aim to improve the overall quality of life for beneficiaries, promoting better health, security, and well-being. This initiative aligns with the broader mission of WSSS to uplift vulnerable communities and enable them to lead dignified lives.

The project has encountered challenges, including logistical issues due to remote locations and the economic constraints of beneficiaries. However, WSSS has successfully mitigated these challenges by coordinating with local authorities, using efficient project management practices, and securing necessary resources to keep the project on track.
