ASHAKIRANAM CANCER CARE CAMPAIGN

Health promotion, prevention, and the provision of adequate quality treatment are key strategies to address the burden of cancer. However, the first two will take several years of continuous effort to have the expected impact in the population and the latter requires the development of appropriate and accessible health infrastructure and technology for the good quality provision of care. In the meantime thousands of terminal patients can be relieved from their pain and suffering by using low cost approaches and mainly community based strategies. To prevent cancer and other killer diseases, Caritas India has facilitating various initiatives through Ashakiranam project all over India. Recently Mananthavady diocese and Wayanad social service society is also associated with Caritas India in this unique project. Wayanad social service society has successfully implemented many cancer/killer disease prevention programs. Among them WSSS organic farming program is very much fulfilling the objectives of Ashakiranam Project. Through co coordinating fifteen thousand farmers in organic farming practices, WSSS is creating a healthy ecosystem for the human beings as well as living organisms. As part of Ashakiranam project around two hundred volunteers has been identified and they were given a General Awareness Program.

DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA

Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) is the skilling and placement initiative of the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Government of India. According to Census 2011, India has 55 million potential workers between the ages of 15 and 35 years in rural areas. At the same time, the world is expected to face a shortage of 57 million workers by 2030. This presents a historic opportunity for India to transform its demographic surplus into a demographic dividend. The Ministry of Rural Development implements DDU-GKY to drive this national agenda for inclusive growth, by developing skills and productive capacity of the rural youth from poor families.

Implementation of DDU-GKY involves State Governments, Technical Support Agencies like the National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (NIRD & PR) and Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs).

Features of DDU-GKY

- **Enable Poor and Marginalized to Access Benefits**-Demand led skill training at no cost to the rural poor
- **Inclusive Program Design**-Mandatory coverage of socially disadvantaged groups (SC/ST 30%; Minority 60%; Women 33%)
- **Shifting Emphasis from Training to Career Progression**-Pioneers in providing incentives for job retention, career progression and foreign placements
- **Greater Support for Placed Candidates**-Post-placement support, migration support and alumni network
- **Proactive Approach to Build Placement Partnerships**-Guaranteed Placement for at least 75% trained candidates

- **Enhancing the Capacity of Implementation Partners**-Nurturing new training service providers and developing their skills
- **Standards-led Delivery**-All program activities are subject to Standard Operating Procedures that are not open to interpretation by local inspectors. All inspections are supported by geo-tagged, time stamped videos/photographs.

Benefit of DDU-GKY Courses

- These courses are completely free of cost.
- The class time is between 9 am to 5pm.
- All students will receive training material free of cost including work books, note books, Tablets and other study materials.
- The trainees will be provided travel allowances of Rs 125 for those who complete 8 hours of training per day.
- Free training will be provided on Soft skills-Communicative English, Life Skills, IT Skills& Character development along with domain trade.
- All candidates will be assessed free of cost and those who pass will be given Training Certificates as per NCVT &SSC guidelines.
- All successful student will be get placed and get minimum salary of Rs-7000/- for three month course and Rs-8500/- for six month course

Achievements

WSSS has officially started DDUGKY on 12/08/2016. We have completed 36 batches in different courses. We have trained 984 students' in 36 batches and completed assessment and placement. We have placed about 804 candidates in different Companies and Restaurant. We have 15 Foreign Placement; consider the performance of past years WSSS has got the new targets of 315 candidates. Most of our students are working outside the state with high salary.

NCVT Certification

We are providing NCVT & SSC certification for each courses and we have conducted External Exam for every batch and distributed their certificate.

Regular MoRD, Kudumbashree Inspection

To ensure the high quality of training both MoRD and Kudumbashree team conducted regular inspection. WSSS could able to reach the expectation of the team.

Students Mobilization, Counselling and Selection

Section of students for this project is done through a mobilization camp. Counselling plays crucial role in the selection procedure of the candidate. Kudumbashree has done arrangement for mobilization in the initial stage.

This project is job oriented and we have to make sure that all students get job that match their aspirations and attitude. We have placed almost 165 students in different company. Biowin Agro Research, Walnut, KITEX Garments pvt Ltd, Chikins, Jayalakshmi, KFC, McDonalds, Hyson Restaurant Pvt Ltd, Chinoose Food Products Pvt Ltd, ID Fresh Pvt Ltd Bangalore, Santhome Creations, Tirupur Assisi Garments Pvt Ltd Tirupur, Hi Tex Wedding Castles, Patturumal Wedding Centre, Joy Ice-creams, Cafe –Coffee Day, Wood Land Hotels, Oxi Farm Resort, Shobha Developers, Burmman Hospitality, Aloe Vera and other Small industries in Kerala are the main placement institutions.



ALTERNATIVE ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

During the last four decades WSSS have been promoting various renewable Energy technologies which are cost efficient and meet the energy needs of the rural people. Promotion of alternative, non-conventional energy sources like biogas, solar domestic lights, rain water tanks and smokeless choola etc. have been well integrated with other development work for the sustainable agriculture and livelihood promotion. Further, it has been organising awareness generation programs and has successfully adopted waste management systems. WSSS has been pioneers in adopting ferro-cement technology, which is an innovative and cost-efficient technology adopted in the construction of Biogas plants and construction of tanks for vermin compost and rain water harvest. 30% of cost reduction in construction makes this widely accepted among rural communities. During the year WSSS constructed 14 Biogas plants and availed subsidy for all candidates 14 plants from KVIC

Kerala Labour Movement (KLM) is a civil society organization registered under the Kerala Charitable Societies Registration Act of 1955 in the year 2004 with the register No. ER 620/04 to operationalise its strategies for the effective organization of the informal workers of Kerala. Now Kerala Labour Movement (KLM) works under the umbrella of Labour Commission of Catholic Bishops Council of Kerala as an effective NGO who caters the developmental needs of the unorganized labourers of the Kerala State. KLM has a central level committee representing the different diocesan KLMs and functions in the dioceses through parish or village level committees, for the laborers and the Self Help Groups.

KLM Mananthavady Diocese is the Organ of KLM. It consists of standing for ensure the Job security and provide the maximum support for the labors from getting the government and comprehensive development of the unorganized Labours in Wayanad and Certain region in Kannur and Malappuram. Now, we have 1572 KLM members in an around the 50 Unit of Mananthavady diocese, Kerala. Most of the KLM Members in Swalamban Scheme, Because of when the members join in the Swalamban scheme, it ensure the Minimum pension of Rs1000 per monthly. KLM has other four Welfare Schemes like Kerala Cherukida ThottamThozhilali Forum (KCTTF),SwathanthraNirmanathozhilali Union (SNTU), Kerala Domestic Workers Forum (KDWF), and Kerala Tailoring Thozhilali Forum (KTTF).

Radio Mattoli is a Community Radio Service (CRS) licensed by the Union Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, New Delhi; and situated at Dwaraka (Mananthavady) in Wayanad District of Kerala State. Community Radio Service focuses on different communities living within its transmission zone. CRS reaches out to every section of the society with special attention to the communities that are marginalized, to ensure that they also find expression through the radio. It provides farmers, tribes, Dalits, women and children an opportunity to speak out, and be heard.



SAVE A FAMILY PLAN

INTRODUCTION

SAFP began its journey in 1977 under the Mananthavady diocese. Over the past 40 years, more than 6300 families under the diocese had received the organisation's support. By the end of the previous financial year around 330 families were receiving support under us. According to the eligibility criteria, many families part of the project are Cancer affected, HIV affected, families with disabled members or widow headed.

EDP TRAINING

The EDP training had been provided to 30 new family beneficiaries this year. The training was a one day programme and had been conducted in two sessions in which one of the sessions was General orientation and the other was EDP training on Soap & Detergent making. The session influenced the newly selected beneficiaries on the need to have a small scale income generation. Many of the beneficiaries bought the materials and started a small scale soap making on their own.

LOCAL SPONSORS MEET

A meeting of all the local sponsors (sisters) who help the families involved in the Save a Family Plan program in the parishes was held on March 11 at WSSS. Former Director, Caritas India, Rev. Fr. Varghese Mattamana was the keynote speaker. Rev. Fr. James Kuttimackal inaugurated the meeting. Rev. Fr. Paul Koottala, Executive Director of WSSS presided. Associate Director Fr. Jinoj Palathadathil, Program Officer Mr. P. A. Jose, and Diocesan Coordinator Sr. Anilit FCC also spoke. Regional Animators Mrs. Suja Mathew, Mrs. Sheena Antony and Mrs. Shiny George provided the lead. 46 Sisters from various parishes attended the meeting. Rev. Fr. Paul Koottala honored the sisters by providing gifts.



REGIONAL MEETING

During this financial WSSS conducted Regional meetings in Mananthavady, Kalpetta and Pulpally Regions. Rev.Fr.Jinoj Palathadathil (Associate Director of WSSS) led the session on Social Security Schemes.

CENTRAL LEVEL AND FAMILY ASSISTING TEAM MEETINGS.

The family assisting team including the parish priest, local sponsor sisters, SHG group leaders, PRI members gathered together in the parish level to discuss about the families for better monitoring and guidance of the family. And also twice in a year, a special group meeting had been conducted in the parish level under each parish.

FAMILY VISITS

The co-ordinator and the animators visit the families regularly to be acquainted with the family in a better way. They also help to guide & support the families to have an idea about their future plans.

TRADITIONAL PEPPER CONSERVATION PROJECT

Black pepper originated in south India, and is extensively cultivated in tropical regions. Both wild and domesticated pepper plants are widely distributed in the Malabar regions of Wayanad and Kannur districts. Pepper being a domesticated spice plant, the conservation of traditional pepper varieties needs prime concern. It has been found that many strains of pepper have been distributed in the Malabar belt. Unfortunately, many of the traditional pepper varieties are under threat due to the inattention of farmers and climate change. Many improved varieties of pepper had been developed by spices research centers in the concerned area and the yielding performance of these had found to be more promising on long term basis. Among these, the most successful variety is panniur. The primary survey proved that still many of the resistant varieties of pepper are identified in the village cultivation land.

Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) is implementing the project at Boys town in Wayanad District. This project has influenced the organization's activities on bio-diversity conservation and organic farming. The project focuses on the conservation and promotion of traditional pepper varieties identified in the Malabar belt. Wayanad being a part of Nilgiri biosphere, the diverseness of traditional pepper is extremely high. The present project focus on the conservation of traditional pepper and the promotion of cultivation practices of eminent ones. It also focuses on the conservation of bio-diversity and the promotion of traditional farming.



FASHION DESIGNING & GARMENT TECHNOLOGY

In order to combat the unemployment problem among the girls completed the school; the Wayanad Social Service Society started a vocational training course in tailoring at its office campus 18 years ago. The course strictly followed the govt. syllabus and training norms accordingly the trainees on successful completion of the training were entitled for govt. certificates with validity to get employed as tailoring teachers in schools. The govt. now has revised the course by upgrading some of the subjects and including new ones in order to cope up with



changed demands of employment in the garment sector which is on the path of steady progress. The duration of the certificate course is the same two years whereas the name of the vocational trade stands changed as 'Fashion Designing & Garment Technology'. This Course was approved by the Kerala State technical Education Department

There is a thorough revision in the subjects also with several new additions like Embroidery, painting, Basic Computer Education, and Spoken English etc. with a vision to enhance the employment potential of young women in the backward district of Wayanad with vocational skills and innovation matching with global standards. The candidates for admission should have completed 10th Standard Examination with a maximum age of 35 years.

JEEVAN MADHUR- MICRO INSURANCE POLICY

The Jeevan Madhur policy is to cover individuals from the economically underprivileged segments of the society in the 18 to 60-year age group. The minimum sum assured under the plan is Rs. 5,000, while the maximum is Rs 30,000. The term of the policy ranges between five to fifteen years. Jeevan Madhur policy is a micro-insurance product of LIC. The policy has got high momentum among the poor by way of Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam during the golden Jubilee celebration of LIC.

JANASREE BHIMA YOJANA

Hon. Union Finance Minister in his budget speech 2008-09 announced a new insurance scheme "Janashree Bima Yojana" (JBY), a Death-cum-Disability Insurance Scheme for the members of all women self-help groups' credit linked to the banks. The objective of the scheme is to provide life insurance cover to the rural and urban poor persons living below poverty line and marginally above poverty line.

SNEHANIDHI

Snehanidhi is a benevolent fund mobilized for emergency assistance to support the families in distress during the period of lent season under the direction of the Bishop since 1980. This programme is implementing through the Foranes under the guidance and initiative of WSSS without fail since its inception.

LEGAL AID CENTRE

Legal Aid Centre based in the campus of WSSS is a voluntary, nonsectarian, nonpolitical, educational and charitable organization sponsored by the Diocese of Mananthavady. The center focuses on the poor, unorganized and exploited sections of the society, particularly the women, children, dalits, and tribal by extending professional legal services free of service cost.

ORGANIC FARM CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Wayanad Social Service Society is one of the leading organizations to promote organic agriculture and Organic agriculture certification programme in Kerala. Starting with the small groups of 109 organic farmers in the year 2000, and now the program has been extended to 18774 farmers in 1144 villages in different parts of Wayanad and 2 Panchayaths (Cherankod&Nellakkotta) from Nilgiri district, Tumilnadu, covering a total area of 15819.17 Hectors; among them 8860 farms with 6325.26 hector area, are organic certified and others are in conversion stage. It is the largest Small Farmer's Group Certification Programme in Kerala.

Through organic agriculture WSSS aims to promote sustainability of small and marginal farmers and their livelihoods, sustainable and eco-friendly life style and sustainable farms. With an integrated approach to the entire farming system and with focus on all aspects of production, processing and value addition and marketing, a new awareness and learning is being generated among the farming community, enabling them to avail the opportunities in the context of a global, market-economy even amidst persisting agricultural crisis. As the programme has not many parallels of its kind in Kerala, the effort has been so much to create a good model of market led livelihood promotion for the farming community and of participatory Natural Resource Management especially of soil, water and bio-mass, as to bring large number of farmers under the "Organic" label.



The certification is being done by LACON certification agency, Onecert Asia Agri Certification and Indocert certifications are accredited certification bodies under APEDA (Agricultural & Processed Products Export Development Authority), Govt.of India. The organic agriculture production under the ICS (Internal Control System) of WSSS is in compliance with organic production methods as defined by Regulation (EEC) No 889/2008 and/or the National Organic Program of United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Japan Agriculture standard (JAS), and National Program for Organic Production (NPOP), Govt. Of India. Apart from the above mentioned organic certifications our farmers are also certified by Rainforest Alliance (RA) certification and Fair Trade certification from FLOCERT, Germany. All these certifications help our farmers to sell their products as premium products and they are getting a fair value.

PROCESSING & MARKETING

Along with the promotion of organic agriculture production, WSSS has been developing processing, value addition and marketing of the products so as to provide better opportunities for the farmers. Bioland Agro Processing Center at Mananthavady is the initiative of WSSS for its commitment and concern towards the quality driven value added processing of Wayanad products which found a remarkable place in the national as well as international market. The farm produces grown in the Northern Region of Kerala became value added, processed and certified as per EEC Regulation No.834/2007 and subsequent amendments are at par with the legal requirements of USA and other importing countries.WSSS could directly export 90% of its procured coffee and spices. WSSS developed its market in Germany, France, Italy, Belgium, The Netherlands, UK, Finland, Switzerland, Canada, and USA.

Wayanad Social Service Society (WSSS) as the parental organization paved the base for organic certification programme in the year 1999.

disorders and diseases like sickle-cell anaemia. WSSS combines its knowledge, skills and contacts on herbal and traditional medicines in the treatment of these diseases.

FAMILY HEALTH PROTECTION PROJECT

Jeevas philanthropic medical project is a part of humanitarian programs of Manathavady diocese undertaken by WSSS and KLM in association with Star Health Insurance Company. This policy intent to introduce amidst the people with low financial background for the whole family with low premium (3000/-). It aims to extent a supportive hand to the general populace having no health insurance of their family. The policy ensures to include six members from a family from the age limit of 5 months to 70 years and also pledge to provide the claim from the day of registration. The policy assures to credit the expenditure in the account of the policy holder arose during the hospital stay by remaining in the terms and conditions of the policy after submitting the bills and discharge details.

NABARD SANITATION AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

As part of NABARD's nationwide Sanitation awareness campaign, Wayanad Social Service Society organized Sanitation awareness programs were organized at Alakkamuttam, Karimpil, Pallot, Kurukkanmoola, Kapiset and Surabhikavala. The event, organized by WSSS, was attended by members of Self Help Groups, members of NABARD Tribal Development Project and members of the NABARD KfW Soil projects. As part of the campaign, classes, poster displays and distribution of kits containing sanitation items were conducted. And gave a reception to the newly elected people's representatives. Wayanad Social Service Society Executive Director Rev. Fr. Paul Kootala presided over all the training programs. The training program was inaugurated by the people's representatives of the respective areas. Wayanad Social Service Society Associate Director Rev. Fr. Jinoj Palathadathil and Program Officer P.A. Jose led the classes.



FLOOD RESPONSE 2021

FLOOD IN WAYANAD

The entire state of Kerala came to stand still for a couple of week during August 2019 badly caught up by the worst ever flood of the Century, the total loss erasing from the distraction and damages estimated at Rs.1600 billion. Region/District wise the extant of destruction and damages varies with Wayanad standing top particularly relating to agriculture and landed properties. It is quite common everywhere that very poor with least capital resources are destined to live in environmentally hazardous, vulnerable and most backward areas and fall immediate victims of natural calamities. Precisely, this has happened in the case of Wayanad in the recent floods. About 113000 people belonging to 29100 families are reeling under severe livelihood crisis with all their hopes lost. This exigency provides for the urgent need and extreme relevance for the project.

As the leading voluntary organisation with long experience and real mass base, the Wayanad Social Service Society has been all out in service from the very first day of the calamity keeping around the entire Diocesan establishment and all other instruments of support with rescue, relief and rehabilitation operations in order to ameliorate the sufferings of the victims. The Society has been instrumental in mobilizing voluntary services of 280 persons per day for 12 days at a stretch, which works out to 3360 man days. 18 education institutions and parish community halls coming under the Diocese were temporary converted as relief camps. As emergency relief WSSS provided goods and services worth Rs 16 million by mobilizing resources through local collections, diocesan charities, contribution from relief agencies, industrial firms, other Dioceses, etc. besides own funds. The supplies to the victims in order to resume living in their own homes back from the relief camps included food kits for a month, dress/cloth items, bed & blankets, kitchen utensils, wash kits, roofing tarpaulins , books & study materials, etc. reaching out to the entire lot of 3640 families. Medical camps was an essential area of timely intervention along the lines of preventive relief services, the Society being instrumental in conducting 36 programs all over the affected areas in the Diocese. Caritas India and CNEWA are the agencies who associated with WSSS for Relief works.



REHABILITATION PROGRAMS

Wayanad witnessed the most disastrous flood in the last year also. Still, now the people of Wayanad who are one among the least economically developed community remember the natural calamity with great fear. When hundreds of people lost their houses and valuable things, a lot of developmental agencies came forward to support the affected people. Wayanad Social Service Society associated with different development agencies and carried out a lot of activities to re-habitat the affected people and it was a great support to the people. After the flood many projects developmental programs implemented by WSSS with the support of Kerala Catholic Bishops Conference (KCBC), CNEWA, Hosur Diocese, Welfare Services Ernakulam, and own fund.

WSSS provided support for repairing 36 houses and support for constructing 04 new houses under the flood rehabilitation program. Provided Support to 06 families for constructing toilets. As part of livelihood activities provided support to 20 families for poultry rearing, 50 families for Hi - tech Poultry Farming, 03 Families for cow rearing, 25 families for goat rearing, 500 families for pepper and coffee cultivation and 25 families for Sewing Machine. As part of capacity building of the affected community, massive awareness programs are carried out through our Community Radio- Mattoli. The details of the flood rehabilitation program implemented by Diocese of Mananthavady through Wayanad Social Service Society is as follows:-



WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION

Wayanad Social Service Society and NABARD have jointly organized the international Women's Day celebration at WSSS Mananthavady on 08th March 2021. NABARD District Manager Mrs. Jisha V was inaugurated the function. Wayanad Social service Society Executive Director Rev. Fr. Paul Koottala was presided over. Mrs. Asya, Teacher Panagadu HSS gave the women's day message. Wayanad Social service Society Associate Director Rev.Fr.Jinoj Palathadathil, Mr.P.A Jose Program Officer WSSS, Mr. Sherin Babu Block Co ordinator Kudumbasree, Mr. Biju Paul President KLM Diocese of Mananthavadi and Mrs. Alice Cicil Councillor, Mananthavadi Municipal were made the felicitation. As part of the day celebrations, seminar, debate, mock and riots were conducted. NABARD EShakti Program Animators, DDU GKY students, FDGT students and WSSS team members were present in the International Women's Day celebration.



NABARD MEDP TRAINING PROGRAM

Ten days Micro Enterprise Development Programme was conducted at Kappiset, Pulpally with the financial help of NABARD. Mr. Shiju Varghese, Chairman Standing Committee, Mullankolly Grama inaugurated the training program. Wayanad Social service Society Executive Director Rev. Fr. Paul Koottala was presided over. Mr.P.A.Jose, Program Officer explained about the training program. Production of bath soap, washing soap, toilet cleaner, dish wash etc are the main topic covered under the MEDP Program. 30 self-help members from 03 SHGs attend the training program. Rev.Fr.Jinoj Palathadathil (Associate Director of WSSS) Suja Mathew and Sheena Antony (Regional Co ordinators) are the resource persons of the MEDP training program.



NABARD KfW SOIL PROJECT

Climate Change has been impacting agricultural production, productivity and livelihood of the farmer, especially in dry land and rain fed areas. In order to reduce vulnerability of the rural community due to impact of climate change, NABARD had taken up climate change adaptation initiatives in 10 selected Watershed in Wayanad District under KfW- Soil Project. Wayanad Social Service Society is the Program Implementing Agency for the Mattilayam and Porlom Watershed projects in Thonderanadu Grama Panchayaths in Wayanad District.

1. Soil Testing and Distribution of Soil Health Card

Soil testing and distribution of soil health card is one of the most unique project components of the NABARD KfW Soil Project. We were able to test the soil of all the families included in the KfW project in the watershed area and completed the testing. The soil was collected in 08 nano watersheds in the Watershed area. Leaders of the nano Watershed Committee, who were trained in taking soil scientifically, went into the houses and collected the soil. The collected soil was tested in the lab of Brahmagiri Development Society. It is generally found in all soils below ph 05. The content of organic carbon is also very low. In addition, all soils in the watershed area have high levels of Phosphorous. Micronutrients were also found to be very low. The distribution of the soil card is not yet completed.

2. Construction of Earthen Bunds

The most important activity implemented in the Mattilayam & Porlom KfW soil project area is Earthen bund construction. The project was implemented as part of Soil and Water conservation measures. The Earthen bunds were constructed with the objective of preventing soil erosion in the Watershed area, ensuring water conservation, increasing the productivity of agricultural land and thereby ensuring higher income for the farmers. 3000 cubic meters of earthen bunds were constructed in the Mattilayam & Porlom KfW soil project areas. A grant of Rs. 243000/- was sanctioned to 14 beneficiaries under this head. Beneficiaries also contributed Rs 81000 as labor. The project was carried out directly by the beneficiaries, completely eliminating the contractors. Watershed committee members and PFA team members monitored the various stages of the project. Upon completion of the project, the watershed committee members and the PFA team took measurements and transferred the grant amount to the beneficiaries in their bank accounts.



3. Construction of Stone Pitched Bunds

The stone pitched bunds are a low cost and durable project implemented as part of soil and water conservation measures. The bunds were made using rubble stone which is easily available in the KfW soil project area. The stone pitched bunds were constructed with the objective of preventing erosion in the watershed area, ensuring water conservation, increasing the productivity of agricultural land and thereby ensuring higher income for the farmers. Once construction is complete, it will benefit generations to come. 4010square meters of stone pitched bunds were constructed in the KfW soil project area. A grant of was Rs.442800/- sanctioned to 31 beneficiaries under this head. Beneficiaries also contributed Rs 206820/- as labor. The project was carried out directly by the beneficiaries, completely eliminating the contractors. Watershed committee members and PFA team members monitored the various stages of the project. Upon completion of the project, the watershed committee members and the PFA team took measurements and transferred the grant amount to the beneficiaries in their bank accounts.The Stone Pitched bunds are made based on contour line.



4. Open Well Recharging

Drinking water scarcity is one of the most acute problems in the KfW soil project area. Most of the wells in the Mattilayam and Porlom Watershed area dry up during the summer. Drinking water will have to depend on other sources for 03-04 months of the year. It is in this context that well recharging was implemented with the objective of ensuring drinking water in wells at all times. The purpose of this project is to raise the water table in the well by charging the rain water from the roof top. The project includes 20 wells in the Watershed areas. It cost Rs 12,000/- to recharge a well. Out of this Rs. 8000/- was provided as grant amount from the project. Labor support and filtering materials worth Rs.4000 were contributed by the beneficiaries. Because of this project requires more technology, since the beneficiaries could not do it directly, the watershed committee identified and handed over the recharge program to a technical expert.



5. Seed Bank Promotion

Seed Bank promotion is one of the most unique project components of the NABARD KfW Soil Project. Due to climate change in Wayanad, a wide variety of tuber crops and native banana varieties which were available in Wayanad till date are being destroyed. In this context, the seed bank project was included in the KfW soil project to protect native banana varieties and tuber crops. Under this scheme, 100 farmers in Mattilayam and Porlom watershed areas are being provided assistance of Rs. 2500/- for cultivation of banana or tubers in at least 25 cent area.



6. Promotion of Beekeeping

The most important activity implemented in the KfW soil project area is Promotion of Beekeeping. The project was implemented as part of Sustainable NRM and CCA Farming Practices and Food Security. Beekeeping is the best solution to overcome the productivity shortfall in agriculture. Studies have shown that beekeeping in coffee, the main crop in Wayanad, can increase yields by up to 80 per cent. In addition to coffee cultivation, beekeeping can help in the high production of a wide range of crops including cardamom, cashew, vegetable crops and fruits including sappotta. In addition to increasing agricultural production through pollination, it is also possible to earn additional income through honey production. WSSS distributed 500 bee boxes to 100 selected farmers in Mattilayam and Porlom Watershed areas. Boxes containing bees were delivered to the farmers from the High range beekeeping unit in Idukki district. Before the distribution of bee hives, the farmers were given detailed training in beekeeping.



7. Soil Mulching

The Soil mulching are a low cost and very effective project implemented as part of Soil health improvement and productivity enhancement measures. With the objective of protecting farm soils from harsh summers, retaining soil moisture, soil microbial survival and ensuring organic manure for crops WSSS prompted soil mulching programs in Mattilayam and Porlom Watershed as part of NABARD KfW Soil project. About 150 farmers are included in the scheme. The scheme provides assistance of Rs.1000 / - per farmer for mulching at least 50 cents on the farm.



NABARD ESHKTI PROJECT

The National Bank of Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) has launched a project titled “EShakti” for the digitization of all members of Self Help Group (SHG) in India. The project aims to bring all SHG members under the fold of financial inclusion thereby helping them access wider range of financial services. EShakti is designed to capture the demographic and financial profiles of members, including their identification data like Aadhaar and EPIC (Electors Photo Identity Card). The first stage of the project involves capturing master data of all the SHGs in a district that includes financial and non financial information of the SHGs and their members. The SHGs are considered “on boarded” once the data is uploaded to the dedicated server for the project. The next stage in “on mobile” when financial data of the SHGs is downloaded and confirmed through “EShakti” App loaded on Android-based mobiles. The project reaches “go live” status when all the pending transactions are brought up to date. Subsequently, uploading of the current transactions takes place, regularly on a monthly basis. WSSS has functioning as Program Facilitating Agency for NABARD EShakti project. Currently, the digitalization work of 600 SHGs is regularized in WSSS. 20 Animators are doing a very good job of data collection and data entry work.



NABARD VILLAGE PROGRAMS

The Wayanad Social Service Society was successfully completed the Village Level Program with financial assistance from NABARD to impart expert training on financial literacy, social security schemes, sustainable income generation schemes, book keeping and digitization of SHGs to the members of SHGs in Wayanad. The VLP program started on February 09, 2022 and ended on February 28, 2022. Total 2933 SHG members participated in VLP programs. WSSS Completed 100 VLP programs in just 18 days. The VLP program was marked by the participation of the people and the active participation of the newly elected people's representatives. The training was mainly led by Financial Literacy Counselors Mr. Mr. Sudhakaran, Mr. Jili George, Mr. Saseedharan Nair and Mrs. Sindhu Vinod. In addition, the Director, Associate Director and WSSS team members provided

leadership. This extensive training program was organized mainly with the objective of involving the common people of Wayanad in the social security schemes. Out of 2933 participants, 1027 SHG members enrolled in various social security schemes. 193 SHG members joined in Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojan (PMJJBY), 732 SHG members joined in Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojan (PMSBY) 72 SHG members joined in Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana (SSY) and 30 SHG members joined in Atal Pension Yojana (APY). In addition, about 80 per cent of the trainees have expressed interest in joining various security schemes. They have received the application form after the training. By the end of March 2021, most of them will be joining various schemes also few family members will be added to these schemes. NABARD supported VLP was a training that benefited ordinary people the most. In addition to social security schemes, WSSS gave classes on digitalization of SHGs through NABARD EShakti project, Book keeping and about viable income generation programs. Classes on these subjects were conducted by members of the Wayanad Social Service Society team.



SAMRUDHAKUDUMBAM PROJECT

Family Development Program is the core program of the Wayanad Social Service Society. For over 50 years through Save A Family Plan, WSSS has assisted thousands of impoverished families throughout the boundaries of the Mananthavady Diocese in becoming self-reliant. In partnering with these families, Family Development Program supports impoverished families in reaching their full potential and achieve success through key elements such as income-generating initiatives ongoing local support, and individualized family interaction and needs assessments and facilitation, resulting in a quality outcome. Samrudhakudumbam Family Development Program is implemented in Oct-2021 with the support of Biowin Agro Research. The areas of program implementation are comprised of six regions namely Sulthan Batheri, Kalpetta, and Thariode forane of Wayanad District, Manimooly, Nilamboor forane of Malappuram District, Chungakkunnu forane of Kannur District, and Nilgiris region of Tamilnadu State, where the Save A Family Plan, Family Development Program has no access.

A full-fledged training Centre is established for the Organizers, Members of the Social Welfare Societies (SWS), Self Help Group (SHG) members, Staff of WSSS, Farmers, Tribal community, Children, PRI officials and other public for different developmental interventions. This Centre is also a platform for the NGO-Govt network.
